Val is the creator of Gamble Entertainment, where she casts, coproduced, and customizes performances for personal and corporate events. She has appeared in a slew of films, videos, television shows, print advertisements, and national and regional commercials for companies like Publix, ACE Hardware, Wawa, Amscot, Disney, Sea World, Burger King, and various Florida hospitals to name a few.
